You will be contacted by a Surgery Center nurse about your surgery time and location for surgery.

You will be asked to report to the Moore Clinic Ambulatory Surgery Center at 104 Saluda Pointe Drive in Lexington. (See map on back for directions.)

Preparing for Surgery

DO NOT eat or drink anything after midnight the night before your surgery. To prevent potential problems, general anesthesia will not be given to a patient who has eaten. Remember, no breakfast or liquids on the morning of surgery and nothing to eat or drink after midnight the night before surgery.

2 **DO NOT** wear any makeup, contact lenses, nail polish, perfume or jewelry to the hospital. Shower the night before or the morning of surgery. You should also brush your teeth.

Be sure to tell your physician about any and all medications and herbs you routinely take and follow your physician's instructions about them before surgery. **Bring your medications, in their original containers, with you when you come for surgery.**

4 **DO NOT** bring any valuables or money to the hospital on the day of your surgery.

5 You will be required to change into a hospital gown. Wear clothing that is easy to change out of.

6 You will not be able to operate a motor vehicle after your surgery. Please bring a friend or relative who can drive you home. If the patient is a child, bring someone who can observe the child in the car while you drive home.

7 Only one person should accompany each patient coming for surgery. (Exception: as noted earlier, a child should have two escorts.) Please **DO NOT** bring children, of any age, unless they are the patient.
